

What to Expect...
for a Sunday Worship Service
at Trulls Road FMC

We are glad you are considering attending our Sunday morning worship services in-person. In order to give you peace of mind about safety and to help you know what to expect when you attend, here is a detailed list of the procedures we will be following.

1. The purpose of gathering together is to worship through music, prayer and hearing from the Word.
2. The service will be 60 minutes long starting at 10:30 am.
3. Please use every other parking space and allow for physical distancing upon entering the building.
4. Greeters will be scheduled to manage the doors. Each will direct people to check the self-assess sign and move to the sign-in table. Attendees will then be directed to enter the sanctuary.
5. Anyone who has not pre-registered, will have their name added to the roster and invited to move to the sanctuary provided there is space. They will be invited to RSVP for the next Sunday either on the website or call the church to reserve a spot.
6. Non-medical masks or face coverings will be required for all attendees until this restriction is lifted by the municipal authorities. Children under the age of 2 will not be required to wear masks.
7. Attendance will be limited to 100 people. A sign-up form will be provided on the church website and people will be asked to RSVP.
8. Chairs in the sanctuary will be appropriately spaced.
9. Children will be seated with their families. There will be no nursery or children's ministry provided. Parents are encouraged to continue using the Sunday morning Kingdom Kids YouTube channel for resources.
10. The basement of the church will remain closed. Only the washrooms on the main floor will be open.
11. After the service, attendees will be directed to leave household by household, so as to maintain social distance. Ushers will be stationed again at the doors to open doors and clean hand rails.
12. Be assured our facility will be cleaned and sanitized before and after services.
13. To comply with health regulations, the list of attendees will be kept on file in the event someone is later diagnosed with COVID-19, or reports significant symptoms of the disease. In such a case, all those who attended any service that this person also attended, going back 14 days, will be notified.
